Karen Stokes

Mrs. Karen Stokes is an archivist at the South Carolina Historical Society in Charleston. She is the author of numerous articles on South Carolina history, one of which was recently reprinted in *The Civil War in South Carolina: Selections from the South Carolina Historical Magazine*. Mrs. Stokes is the co-editor of *Faith, Valor, and Devotion: The Civil War Letters of William Porcher DuBose*, and a new book published by USC Press, *A Confederate Englishman: The Civil War Letters of Henry Wemyss Feilden*. She is also the author of two non-fiction books published by the History Press, *South Carolina Civilians in Sherman's Path*, and *The Immortal 600: Surviving Civil War Charleston and Savannah*. Her first historical novel, *Belles: A Carolina Love Story*, was released in November 2012.

Memories Of Ones Not Forgotten

The person selected from Memorial Stones to be highlighted in this issue is Captain Daniel Strobel Sr. Daniel was brought to my attention recently by Charles Kizer, a member of the UDCHS, when he ask me to accompany him to take pictures of Daniel's headstone. Daniel Strobel Sr. is Charles' Great Uncle four times removed.

Daniel Strobel Sr., the son of Casper Strobel and Otey Brener, was born 21 August 1765 at Beech Island, in present day Aiken County, at that time Granville County, South Carolina. He was undoubtedly named for his uncle, Capt. Daniel Strobel, brother of Casper, who was born at Lampertheim, Germany in 1735. Daniel Strobel Sr., served during the Revolutionary War and was also a captain, which sometimes confuses him with his uncle. Daniel Strobel Sr., died 26 February 1827 and is buried along with his wife, Elizabeth Aberly Strobel, in the Spring Branch Cemetery near present day Rosinville, SC. The inscriptions on their stones read:

Capt. Daniel Strobel	Elizabeth Strobel, Wife
Died 26 Feb. 1827	Died Dec. 21, 1835
Age 61 yrs. 6 mos. 5 days	Age 74 yrs. 8 mos. 16 days.

- iii) Elizabeth Strobel, born in 1792 in Colleton County, SC. Married Christian Rhode,
- iv) Teresa Ann, born in 1794 in Colleton County, SC. Married Dr. Daniel I. Moorner 14 July 1814. Died 3 Apr 1859.
- v) Daniel Strobel, Jr., born 21 Nov 1796 in Colleton County, SC. Married Lavonia Brownlee 9 May 1837. Died 4 Mar 1877.
- vi) John Strobel, born 29 Aug 1799 in Colleton County, SC. Married 1) Barbara Dantzler, and 2) Martha Brown Miller. Died 13 Sept 1874.
- vii) Eliza or Elvira Strobel, born in 1802 in Colleton County, SC. Married William Bowyer in 1823. Died 17 July 1873, age 70.
- viii) Caroline Strobel, born in 1804 in Colleton County, SC. Married George Bowman.
