#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members,

Happy New Year!

The Dorchester County Archives & History Center celebrated its first anniversary in November 2015. Christine Rice, Archivist/Director, has worked diligently to digitize historic documents relating to the history of Dorchester County. Over 100,000 historic documents have been donated including several rare collections dating back to the early 1700s. Among these collections are original documents signed by William Moultrie (1730-1805) a 2time governor of SC and a Revolutionary War Hero; Charles Pinckney (1757-1824) who was a signer of the US Constitution and the 37<sup>th</sup> governor of SC and also Thomas Pinckney (1750-1828) an early statesman, governor of SC, diplomat and veteran of both the Revolutionary War and the War of 1812. Over 18,000 historic documents including maps, early newspapers and several photo collections have been digitized and are available for research.

The Genealogy Library has been established and to date, over 80,000 names have been added to the database. Family trees are available for sale and as a benefit of becoming a member an updated family tree can be printed at your request every 3-5 years providing you furnish the information.

Charter Membership is available through December 31, 2016. As a charter member, your name will be placed on a plaque hung in the center; also membership provides unlimited research in the Archives and free admission to the History Center during regular business hours. You will also receive four guest passes to the center to give as gifts. Membership to the DCA & HC is separate from the UDCHS. An application is attached. Consider joining as a Charter Member.

Development of the History Center (Dorchester County Museum) is underway. The History Center will display the history of Dorchester County through artifacts, exhibits, audio and visual aids. Education of the history of Dorchester County as it relates to South Carolina history is the objective.. Construction of the center will be completed by the end of 2016.

#### The Way We Worked

In December 2015, the DCA & HC applied to host the Smithsonian Exhibit sponsored by the Humanities Council. The center received notification of the selection just before Christmas. The exhibit, adapted from an original exhibition developed by the National Archives, explores how work became such a central element in American culture by tracing the many changes that affected the workforce and work environments over the past 150 years. The exhibition draws from the Archives' rich collections to tell this compelling story as it documents the lives of ordinary working Americans.

#### Patrick W. Scally

Born and raised in Albany, New York, Patrick Scally received his Bachelor's degree in History from St. Patrick's College (now Maynooth University), near Dublin, Ireland, in 1978. It was here that he first studied paleography – the reading and transcribing of old documents. He continued his education at the State University of New York at Albany, where he received a Master's degree in History in 1981. Continuing his education, he enrolled in a doctoral program at McGill University in Montreal, Canada in 1982, where he was also a teaching assistant. The following year, he began teaching a Western Civilization course to freshman students at Siena College near Albany. In 1984, he relocated to Washington, DC upon being hired by the Central Intelligence Agency as a political and military analyst. In 2000, he switched career tracks within the CIA and became a Senior Reports Officer in the Agency's Directorate of Operations. He retired in 2012 after a career of 28 years, receiving the CIA Career Commendation Medal from then-Director Gen.(ret.) David H. Petraeus, and relocated to South Carolina. In addition to paleographic work at Dorchester County Archives & History Center, he works part-time as a costumed historical interpreter at Middleton Place. He and his wife Carol live in Summerville, where Carol volunteers at their church, Summerville Presbyterian, as well as at Timrod Library. They have two children and two grandchildren.
