Dear Members, Happy New Year!

This year marks the 13th year of our society's charter. Together we have accomplished much: restored the Koger House (circa 1780s), published 3 historical periodicals, acquired the Appleby House and sold it in an effort to preserve it, erected 7 historical markers (number 8 has just been ordered) and developed the Dorchester County Archives and History Center in the former Dorchester County Courthouse. So much history preserved that would have been lost if not for the hard work of so many.

The DCA & HC opened the museum last Saturday, January 28th, featuring a Smithsonian travelling exhibit through March 11th. The museum is open Monday-Friday from 9 am - 4 pm; on Thursdays, hours are extended from 4-7 pm with special guests portraying historical figures, cultural demonstrations, artists, authors and more. Saturdays the center is open from 10-2 pm with a Market Place set up on the front lawn. Opening day was very successful with over 100 people attending.

Our upcoming meeting is scheduled for Thursday February 9th at 7:00 pm. Our meeting will be held at the new museum located in the former Dorchester County Courthouse, 101 Ridge Street, St. George. You are invited to come early to enjoy the cultural demonstrations and at the closing of the museum, we will have our membership meeting.

Beginning on Saturday, Feb. 4th, from 11 - 3 pm, the Koger House will be open to the public, hosted by docents in period attire. If you can help docent, please contact Chuck Spell or me. The house will be open every Saturday through March 11th in conjunction with the Smithsonian exhibit.
