Dear Members,

On April 14th, the Koger House was visited by the Dorchester Leadership Group on their annual tour of Upper Dorchester County. Everyone enjoyed their visit. Our meeting on May 12th, at 7 PM, will be at the historic Koger House.

Our speaker will be Peggy Murray Phalen who has extensively researched the house which was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1974 through the efforts of Dr. Gavin Appleby. Dean McCracken, UDCHS Historian, will present his gift of a bronze plaque recognizing this distinguished honor.

Mrs. Phalen had been concerned about the deterioration of the house and the lack of recognition which she felt it deserved. She is responsible for having it named to the list of Most Endangered Properties in South Carolina. Having been listed on this site helped the society acquire the SDOT grant that helped restore the house in 2007-2008.

In 2004, Fitzhugh Sweatman donated the house which had been his family home to the UDCHS, assuring that its future was secure.
