In 2004, Mr. Fitzhugh and Ms. Martha donated the Koger House to the Historical Society; a selfless act and a most generous gift. The society was newborn, yet they entrusted this historic treasure, to the society, in an effort to save it from further deterioration.

MILITARY PROCESSION:
